Where to Vote: Village of North Prairie, Village Hall, 130 N. Harrison Street

Election Hours: Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m

Voter Registration:

Things needed to register:

Proof of residency. If your driver's license does not have your current, please provide a bill with your current address.

Date of Birth

Driver's license number or Wisconsin Identification Number. If you do not possess a driver's license or Wisconsin Identification Number, then you must provide the last four digits of your social security number.

Last Registration Address – Wisconsin Address Changes Only. If you were registered to vote in another municipality in the State of Wisconsin, please provide that address.

The State of WI allows election day registration.

Absentee Voting:

In order to vote absentee, you must be a registered voter in the Village of North Prairie. If not registered, please print and complete the Voter Registration Application form.

If you are registered, please print and complete the Application of Absentee Ballot form and return it to the Village of North Prairie, 130 N. Harrison Street, North Prairie, WI, 53153.

Once the application is received the ballots will then be sent to you. Ballots must be returned to the Village Hall by Election Day in order for the ballot to count. Ballots are available 22 days before the Spring Elections and 30 days before Fall Elections.

When you receive the ballot, please follow these instructions:

1. In the presence of someone authorized to administer oaths in Wisconsin, such as the Village Clerk or a Notary Public, or in the presence of one witness, the voter marks the ballot by connecting the arrows, using a black pen or #2 pencil. If you plan to vote for a write-in: Write the person's name in the "write-in" area, and connect the arrow.
2. The folded ballot is placed in the affidavit envelope and sealed.
3. The voter completes and signs the affidavit envelope.

4. An individual authorized to administer oaths or one witness present, while the ballots were marked, completes the certificate printed on the affidavit envelope. (Witness need not be a resident of the municipality in which the voter claims residency.)
5. The affidavit envelope is returned to the Village Clerk, by mail or in person, so that it arrives on or before Election Day (in time for the Clerk to have it delivered to the polling place by 8:00 p.m.).
