(Waukesha, WI) – Waukesha County Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) staff encourage residents to volunteer for the statewide *Clean Boats, Clean Waters* project to help prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species and fish diseases between lakes, rivers and streams.
